
**Capitol Q&A** The function, history, architecture, and art of the U.S. Capitol. This program is an interactive Q&A for all grade levels, 20-25 min.

#### **What is the Constitution?**

Students learn about Article 1 of the Constitution, the Bill of Rights, and the responsibilities of citizens and Congress. For all grade levels, 30-45 min.



#### FEBRUARY

**Tuesday, February 15 at 10 a.m., or Thursday, February 17 at 1 p.m.**

**Virtual VOTE!** A growing city needs a new water source. The easiest and cheapest source is a river in a national park. Should the city be allowed to dam the river and use the water for its citizens? Or, should the valley remain protected for the use and enjoyment of all Americans? In this program, each student assumes the role of a member of Congress. They hear testimony from both sides, weigh conflicting points of view and make a decision.
